

BINGO

The regular every Wednesday bingo session (2:30 pm – 4:00 pm) was recommenced on February 23rd, 2022 after the Covid 19 pandemic public gathering restrictions were lifted. Total sessions 42 - only 1 session was cancelled in the month of December 2022 due to bad weather. Total player count 482 - an average of 11 players per session. An average of 11 games are played per session and all games are played for \$0.25 cents a card. The revenue from the card sales is paid out as winning prize minimum being \$0.50 cents and not exceeding \$1.00 for a win. Insofar, we have requested and received 2 small contributions from our Treasurer to fund the winning payout which exceeds revenue from the bingo card sales. The bingo games were played in the large multi-function space of the Bonsor +55 Society Centre and recently moved to the smaller meeting room. Presently, the average total player count per session does not justify the use of the bigger space. I thank Phyllis Parsons and Calen Carswel for volunteering their time as callers and the Bonsor +55 Society Centre, Burnaby City staff for setting up for the bingo games.
