

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President's Report – 2026 Annual General Meeting

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to express our sincere appreciation to the many Society members who volunteer their time to serve on group leadership teams. Their dedication and countless hours of service ensure that programs are well organized, properly equipped, and enjoyable for all participants. We are also grateful to the City of Burnaby staff whose ongoing efforts keep our facility operating smoothly and effectively.

The year 2025 presented a number of challenges. Burnaby continues to experience a rapidly growing population, particularly in the Metrotown area, where new residential developments are bringing many new residents seeking connection, programming, and community. As a result, our facility is operating at or beyond capacity, with many groups continuing to grow and requesting additional time and space that we are currently unable to accommodate. We are very thankful for our strong and collaborative relationship with the City of Burnaby, which allows us to work closely together to ensure fair and equitable access to the facility for all members. This partnership remains essential as we navigate ongoing capacity pressures.

Our Society bus continues to be a significant asset to seniors in both Burnaby and New Westminster. It remains the only bus owned by a seniors' society in these communities and serves members from the Bonsor, Cameron, Confederation, and Edmonds Seniors Societies, as well as Century House in New Westminster. In 2025, the bus completed 105-day trips along with two extended overnight trips, providing valuable opportunities for social connection and engagement.

One of the ongoing challenges faced by both the Board and the Society is the disproportionate amount of time spent addressing concerns raised by a small number of individuals who choose criticism over constructive participation. The effort required to manage these situations can discourage members from stepping forward to serve on group leadership teams or the Society Board. A healthy organization depends on cooperation, respect, and shared responsibility. We strongly encourage all members to contribute in a positive and supportive manner that strengthens their groups and the Society as a whole.

Finally, the Society is also facing the reality of an aging Board of Directors. Many current Board members have served with dedication for 10 to 20 years or more. As several prepare to step aside in the coming years, it is vital that new members from our community come forward to ensure continuity, fresh perspectives, and continued strong leadership for the Bonsor 55+ Society.

GROUP REPORTS:

Badminton Group

This year, our group not only upheld its official status but did so through an extraordinary collective effort that showcased the best of our community. We launched a dedicated website designed to spark interest in badminton across Burnaby and to offer clear, accessible information for anyone wishing to join. In the spirit of fairness and transparency, we also committed to implementing an on-demand registration system to ensure that all Burnaby residents have equitable access to our badminton group. Strengthening our group from within remained a central focus. We hosted two well-attended tournaments, one in June and another in November— each followed by a celebratory dim sum lunch that allowed members to connect beyond the court. We also offered badminton clinics to support skill development and deepen members' enjoyment of the sport. As the year drew to a close, we celebrated Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas with modest but meaningful festivities that added warmth and connection to our community. These shared moments, both big and small, helped bring our group even closer together and reinforced the sense of belonging that defines us.

Baking Group

As always, the Baking Group continues to provide delicious cookies and muffins for the Coffee Bar. The volunteers who run the Coffee Bar serve beverages and treats for all members of 55+. Please come and enjoy our 55+ Lounge!

BEARS

We are a small group of knitters and crocheters who meet weekly (Friday 1:30-3:30) to make items which we sell at our annual craft fair. Proceeds from the craft fair support local charities and Bonsor 55+ Centre.

Although we are not teachers (that is a special skill), we are always willing, and usually able, to help anyone trying to remember what they learned as a child, or what YouTube is saying. We also talk about food a lot.

Bingo

Bingo is a game of chance played with cards having numbered squares corresponding to numbers drawn at random by a game host. There is a charge of \$0.25 per card and the games are held on Wednesdays, from 2-4 pm.

Bridge (American Standard)

A friendly group meets every Tuesday, year-round, from 1 to 4 pm in the Bonsor 55+ Centre room MP3 for an afternoon of practicing bridge skills and non-competitive bridge play. This is an Intermediate Level group and some playing experience is desirable, but you don't need to be an expert to join us. We encourage additional players to come and try out our group. BRIDGE (DUPLICATE) Duplicate (Bridge is a more competitive style of Bridge. Duplicate bridge is a variation of contract bridge where the same set of bridge deals (i.e. the distribution of the 52 cards among the four hands) are played by different competitors, and scoring is based on relative performance. We meet Monday 1 – 4 pm. New members are always welcome.

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Bonsor Bus

In 2025 the Bonsor Minibus was on the road for 110 outings and a total of 13,967 kilometers, including 2 overnight trips. We hope you had a lot of fun times with our fun seeking seniors and perhaps discovered some venues previously unknown to you!

Looking ahead! Welcome to Bob Wilson, our newest addition to the Volunteer Driver list, and to Robin Cleland, returning to the program.

A huge thank-you to all our volunteer drivers, to Monica who coordinates all of the trips, and to Keith who makes sure the bus is always properly maintained and cleaned.

Choir (Bonsor Singin' Seniors Choir)

2025 has been a low-key year, but very enjoyable. Because our choir membership is becoming more culturally diverse, welcoming people from all corners of the world, from Italy, Argentina, Greece, France, China, Korea, Mexico, Angola, Taiwan, Poland, Malaysia and more, we also tried to diversify the music so everyone could feel included. Such diversity also means that members travel a lot and are often missing for a couple of weeks or months. On average, we had about 20 singers per session, although about 30 actually paid for their yearly membership.

Most of the repertoire came from members' suggestions. We had quite a few concerts on our own and participated in two choir meetings, at Edmonds in Burnaby (Senior Choirs Jamboree event) and in Coquitlam at Dogwood Pavilion (Seniors Choir Extravaganza). These two events were memorable and allowed us to share and listen to four other seniors' choirs. All our own concerts were enthusiastically received by the audience as we tried to engage them in fun and singing.

We would love to recruit more men, but this is the problem of many choirs!

Coffee Bar

The Open Art Studio group meets every Tuesday afternoon. It is non-instructional. Visual artists are welcome to come and work on their favorite projects such as painting, drawing, calligraphy etc. during the session and enjoy the company of their fellow artists. We also have an art library with books donated over the years by the members.

Some activity highlights of 2025 were:

- We continued the theme painting project this year. A different theme was chosen each month and members created paintings along that theme which were showcased on the second-floor display boards.

- In June, we were invited to display at the Seniors' Lifestyle Expo organized by Mulberry PARC. The show was held at the Bonsor main building. Along with many other groups and vendors we showcased art as a leisure activity for seniors.
- In July, Pauline Lowe was very gracious to host two BBQs for our members and demonstrated painting with Indian Ink and compressed air. We very much enjoyed Pauline and Warren's hospitality.
- We participated in the Mulberry PARC annual art show on Sep 12. In addition to the regular display, we also set up a separate table to demonstrate the Indian Ink painting technique by Pauline. The demo was well received by our host as well as visitors to the show. We look forward to next year's show.
- We were invited to participate in an "Elders in Community" event at Maywood School on Nov 28. Eight members from Open Art joined 14 gr 5-7 students in small groups to create art during their lunch time. Everyone enjoyed the event.
- The Artist of the month displays continued. Members of the group took turns in featuring their paintings in the dedicated picture frames in the lounge as well as our Bonsor 55+ webpage.
- A year end group potluck party was held on Dec 16. Good food and good company were enjoyed by all.

We ended 2025 with 37 members. The group is co-led by Goodwin Young and Pauline Lowe. All Bonsor 55+ members are welcome to bring their own supplies and join us to create their own masterpiece. We thank Bonsor for providing us with the facility and doing the setup every week before we meet. Special thanks to Bonsor 55+ center acting supervisor Chelsea Pereira who facilitated the replacements of the display boards and the additions of 14 new picture frames in 2025 to display our paintings.

Practice Line Dance

Sing Along

The Sing Along group has been with Bonsor for over 30 years. We meet every other Thursdays at Bonsor Multi 1& 2 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. W break between June and September and sometimes during March.

We have about 40 members. They are all members of Bonsor Recreation Centre. We charge \$10.00 per year for Sing Along membership. We have 3 members over the age of 90.

We sing English songs from 50s, 60s, and musical theatre. We have a group /song leader, a pianist, a drummer, a song leader, a treasurer, 2 coffee masters, and 2 technical workers. 9 volunteers in total. We celebrate with potlucks on different occasions. We also offer solo opportunities to our members. We are a fun and growing group.

The Bonsor Snooker Club

The Bonsor Snooker Club is strong with some 70 members. In addition to a variety of designated club activities, the club offers daily free-play time to members. The skill level ranges from novice to expert; the club offers a variety of opportunities to learn and improve skill levels. To encourage less skilled players to participate in club activities a handicap system is used.

As the year began, the club's B-team was fully engaged in once-weekly (home and away) matches in the Lower Mainland Senior Snooker League (LMSSL). Bonsor club members won the LMSSL post-season A-League doubles competition and the open 70+ singles. In addition, the in-house, ever-popular Ladder Tournament (Dec 1, 2024-March 31, 2025) was well under way.

Soon to follow was the George Kawaguchi high handicap tournament (handicap 15+), the Harvey Lee double knock-out tournament, and the 9-Ball tournament.

In May, Bonsor brought home the Mary Horton trophy, winning the twice-yearly competition with West Vancouver. Unfortunately, the second meeting was cancelled by West Van due to their shortage of players.

As summer approached the Bonsor 4-team, in-house summer league got started (May – August). And, during this time, the 32-player Harvey Lee double knock-out tournament, the Billiards tournament, the David Braganza snooker tournament (top 16 players from the Ladder) were all completed successfully.

Our enjoyment of snooker and related games was capped off with an enjoyable luncheon at Kirin Restaurant where player achievements were recognized.

On the business side of the snooker club, the YGM was held on August 4th, at which time Robert Lockhart, Su Herrmann, Dan Hanna, David Braganza, and Jong Tseng were elected to the Executive Committee.

The 2025-2026 Ladder tournament started on December 1, 2025, with great expectations for another successful year.

Social Line Dance

This group meets every Wednesday from 1:00pm – 3:00pm. The fee is \$1.00 for members, and \$3.00 for non-members. Due to limited floor space, a maximum of 35 participants will be admitted at each session. The program is led by volunteer dancers with other volunteers assisting. We do mostly easy beginner dances. It's a great way to exercise your body and mind, to enjoy the music, and to make new friends.

Our 2nd Christmas party was held on December 17, 2025, with a total of 30 attendees. It was full of fun, joy and laughter, another memorable event to remember.

We would like to thank the 55+ Society, and the staff at the 55+ Centre for supporting our program.

Social Line Dance Friday

Social line dance Friday is a drop-in program held every Friday between 1-3 pm. This program caters to line dancers with beginners plus to improve level capability. Brief instructions are given and conducted in English. Links to YouTube line dance videos used during the class are supplied so members can look before coming to class. All dance leaders are volunteers.

Admission fee is \$1 for 55+ member and \$3 for non-members. Floor capacity is 36 dancers on a first come, first served basis. Twice a year the group leader will organize social events for the members; one at Christmas and one at Lunar New Year.

Table Tennis

Our Spring lunch in March 2025 drew 120 members. Our registration in June 2025 saw an enrolment of 242 members. Our quarterly enrolment on the first Saturday of September 2025 17 Burnaby residents were accepted. Our quarterly enrolment on the first Saturday for the month of December attracted 10 new members. This brought our total to 269 members. A new T-shirt logo was introduced, and a total of 70 T-shirts were ordered.

Tennis Club

Our tennis group has a record of 48 members registered. We are fortunate and thank the City of Burnaby and Bonsor Senior Society for reserving Central Park courts #9-10-11-12 every Monday, Wednesday, Friday from 9:00-12:00 noon. Tennis season fee is \$50 which runs from mid-April to end of September.

The club held two complimentary pizza/watermelon days. A fun social tournament took place with trophies to 1st place winners to Georgina Wong/Fred Peng and runners up to Jim Chow/Kahlid Sitlu.

A complimentary year end dinner took place Sept 26th at the Bonsor Main Building. It was a well-attended fun event with games and prizes.

The election of 2026 officers were hosted by liaison Albert Lam.

Yang Style Tai Chi

Our group had a leadership change in mid-March 2025. Mr. Sonny Lee, who started this tai chi group along with Ms. Rosalind Change, had resigned as the group leader for medical reasons. Our treasurer, Ms. Patricia Lee, had also resigned from her volunteer post at about the same time. Ms. Bessie Fong along with Ms. May Luk, have since taken over and shared the group leader and treasurer role.

As of December 2025, our group has 67 paid members and continues to welcome new participants. We are fortunate to have Mr. Arsenio Chua as our main volunteer instructor and Ms. Rosalind Chang as a substitute volunteer instructor when Mr. Chua is away. A few of our more experienced members also help in leading the tai chi exercises in the absence of our usual instructor and in tutoring newcomers who have no prior tai chi knowledge.

Our classes are held on Tuesday from 1:30 to 3:30 pm in room MP1 and on Friday from 8:30 to 10:45 am in room MP1&2. Our class attendance in 2025 had ranged from a low of 14 right after Christmas to a high of 33, with 27 and 28 people being the most frequent number.

In 2025, besides the Chinese New Year and Christmas parties, our social committee organized other activities that were open to all members. There was a lunch gathering at Riverway Club House in March, a picnic and trail walk at Fraser Foreshore Park in May, an Alaskan cruise in September and a Christmas lunch buffet in December. All fees for these extra activities were collected from participating members only and kept separate from the Yang style tai chi group membership fees. Traditional Double Yang Tai Chi

2025 marks another successful year for the Traditional Double Yang Tai Chi Group. Thrice weekly, we practice Tai Chi in the multi-purpose rooms under the guidance of Master Victor Chow, who has been volunteering his time and efforts in teaching Tai Chi in the community for more than 25 years. The Group has 35 members, each paying an annual due of \$25.00. Highlights of our 2025 activities were: the summer luncheon and the Christmas luncheon. Both events were well attended.
