



# How to add bookmarks & set a home page on your web browser




# Open a web browser




Type in the web page you want (it's best if you open the exact page that you want). For example if you want the log in page for your bank, go to that page before clicking the star.



This is what it looks like in Chrome



This is what it looks like in Edge (notice they call it Favorites)




This is what it looks like in Firefox


*You can add as many bookmarks/favorites as you like. I would suggest that you only save the few that you use the most frequently to the bookmarks bar.*

To save a page to the other bookmarks list, just click on the down arrow and choose either “Other bookmarks” or “Favorites”




Now, if you would like a web page to come up each time as soon as you click on your web browser, that's called a "Home page".

To start, in the address bar of your web browser, type the address of the web page you want to come up as your home page. I'm going to choose Google.ca for this example.




2. Click on the menu icon then click settings



This will open a “Settings” tab

Where it says “On start-up” click Open a specific page..... [Set pages](#)




*Note this area too - “Appearance”*

A small box will pop up (shown below)

Here, you can either click “Use current pages” if your web browser is already on the page you want as your home page or you can type `www.google.ca` (example) where it says Enter URL. Then click OK



Under the “Appearance” section, click in the circle “Show Home button”. This will show the house /home icon to the left of your address bar, so anytime you want to go back to Google, just click the house/home icon!


